## Focus on Creative Commons (CC)

### Finding Creative Commons images

Visit <https://search.creativecommons.org/> to search for CC licensed images. All results returned include the relevant licensing information.

### Creative Commons Licenses

There are several types of CC licenses with different rights assigned. To help check the rights of each at a glance please consult our table.

Let's explore the different licensing options in more detail:

#### Attribution

##### CC BY



This is the most flexible in terms of usage. You can distribute, edit, amend and build upon these images for commercial work (eg promotional materials / marketing). You must credit the photographer.

#### Attribution-ShareAlike

##### CC BY-SA



Using this attribution gives you the right to allow others to distribute, edit, amend and build upon these images for commercial work. However any work they create must be made available under the same terms, and they must credit you.

#### Attribution-NoDerivs

##### CC BY-ND



Content can be redistributed for commercial and non-commercial purposes as long as it is unchanged and in whole, and they must credit you.

## Attribution-NonCommercial

### CC BY-NC



This gives others the right to distribute, edit, amend and build upon your images for non-commercial work. Although they must credit you, the derivative works do not have to be licensed on the same terms.

## Attribution-NonCommercial-Sharealike

### CC BY-NC-SA



Others have the right to distribute, edit, amend and build upon your images for non-commercial work. They must credit you, and new works should be licensed under the same terms.

## Attribution-NonCommercial-NoDerivs

### CC BY-NC-ND



This is a fairly restrictive license. Others can download the share your images if you are credited. However images cannot be changed in any work or used commercially.
